

Potential Causes of Toxic Leadership


"Potential Causes of Toxic leadership" (Johnson, 2020)

- Unhealthy motivations (Fear, Insecurity, etc.)
- Self-Centeredness
- Faulty Decision Making (see 'justifications' slide)
- Failure of Moral Imagination (need better coaching)
- Moral Disengagement (not caring about others)
- Contextual Factors (Sport Culture; Masculinity Contests)
- Unmet psychological Needs
- Personality Disorders

Experienced Forms of Harm



Prevalence of Maltreatment in Sport


Experiences of at Least 1 Form of Harm by Self-Reported Gender




